Rachael Hendricks, a senior at Parkland High School, started her musical career on the piano, which she studied for 7 years. From 2003 until 2010, Rachael studied clarinet with Alfred Reimschissel. She currently studies clarinet with Deborah Andrus, as she has since 2010. She has been studying clarinet for 9 years and also been playing the alto saxophone for 8 years.



At Parkland High School, Rachael served as Drum Major of the marching band her junior and senior years. She is currently the Band President and participates in Marching Band, Symphonic Band, Orchestra, Jazz Ensemble, and Pit Orchestra. Rachael has participated in countless PMEA (Pennsylvania Music Educators Association) festivals, including PMEA District 10 Band and Orchestra, PMEA Region V Band, PMEA Region IV/V Orchestra, PMEA All-State Concert Band, PMEA All-State Orchestra, and PMEA All-State Wind Ensemble. This year at the All-State festival, she ranked 2nd in the state of Pennsylvania. Rachael was also selected for the 2011 MENC (Music Educators National Conference) All-Eastern Wind Ensemble in Baltimore, Maryland.

Academically, Rachael is a member of the National Honor Society, National English Honor Society Spanish, Honor Society and Spanish Club.
